ACCRINGTON, WOODNOOK (Alley Gating) Public Spaces Protection Order (No 1 of 2017) (“The Order”)

NOTICE OF PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

Notice is Hereby Given that on the 11th October 2017 Hyndburn Borough Council (“the Council”) made the above Public Spaces Protection Order under section 59(1) of Part 4 Chapter 2 of the Anti–Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 (“the Act”) and all other enabling powers.

1. The Order relates to the back alleys adjacent to, and to the rear of the properties in Accrington known as 30-62 South Street including 1 Hudson Street , and 1-33 Booth Street including 3 Hudson Street, and 54-86 Royds Street (now known as 54-78 Royds Street including 9 Hudson Street and 1-33 Augusta Street (now known as 1-27 Augusta Street) including 11 Hudson Street and 2-32 Augusta Street (now known as 2-22 Augusta Street) including 13 Hudson Street and 1-31 Wilfred Street (“the Highways”). The location of the Highways is shown on the plan appended to the Order attached to this notice.
2. The effect of the Order is to restrict the public right of way over the Highways to the owners and occupiers of the properties mentioned in paragraph 1 above, the police, statutory undertakers, local authorities and the emergency services. The Order will authorise the installation of barriers at the approximate location marked red on the plan appended to the Order to enforce this restriction.
3. The installation maintenance and operation of the barriers will be the responsibility of PlaceFirst, Eastgate, 2 Castle Street, Manchester, M3 4LZ
4. The Council made the Order because anti-social behaviour on the Highways appears to be having a detrimental impact on the quality of life in the locality and it is likely that such anti-social behaviour is likely to be of a

persistent or continuous nature such as to make it reasonable to impose the measures in the Order.

5. The Order will be in force for a period of three years.
6. It will be an offence under section 67 of the Act for any person, without reasonable excuse to;

Do anything that the person is prohibited from doing by the Order, or

To fail to do comply with a requirement to which the person is subject under the provisions of the Order

Any person guilty of an offence under this section will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.
