Hi,

I've highlighted some minor matters in the document which require amending.

1. *8.23 - Lancashire County Council are working on a Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) for the Borough and surrounding areas which has been informed by the Local Plan and which will be taken into account when planning future development.*

The above statement is out of date as the LCWIP was published April 2024.

2. *Policy HP3: Land n. of Sandy Lane, ix - Reference to un-adopted road*

The above statement requires amendment to remove 'un-adopted' which is an incorrect reference. The correct term is 'not publicly maintained or privately maintained'

3. Any references to Transport Assessments should reference Lancashire County Council's Decide and provide document published April 2025 offers a step-change in how transport is assessed, with a greater focus on vision, different scenarios, and measuring success of interventions. All developments that generate a significant amount of movement should be supported by a vision-led transport statement or transport assessment.
